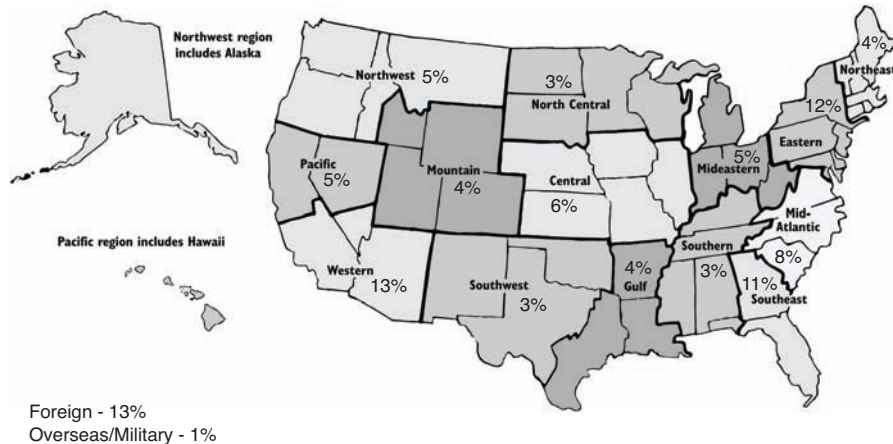


# 2006 Skydiving Review
